Dear participants,

Infected wounds are wounds in which bacteria or other microorganisms have colonized, causing a delay in wound healing and leads to additional scar tissue formation. Most wounds are typically contaminated by bacteria. However, infected wounds result when the body's immune defenses are overwhelmed or cannot cope with normal bacterial growth. Invasion of microorganisms into the tissue layers below the dermis may also result in bacteremia, sepsis, and multiple-organ dysfunction syndrome.

An infected wound may be characterized by increased or sustained pain, redness or swelling, pus discharge, bad odor or non-healing of the wound. The primary factor that needs to be addressed in wound infections is proper wound care. A wound requires a moist (not wet) environment for proper functioning of the cells responsible for wound healing. A number of advanced dressings, which are currently available, require less frequent dressing changes and may provide the added benefit of faster wound healing.

This workshop is organized to improve our skill to choose appropriate wound dressings to support the natural wound healing process.
